## Global MRL Challenges: Information

- Keeping up-to-date with regulations and procedures for countries to export commodities to.
- Multiple national agencies often involved in setting MRLs; important to know role of each.
- Obtaining current, accurate, timely knowledge of MRLs established or amended and basis.
- Determining and understanding different data requirements to establish MRLs set by national authorities often difficult; maximize the usage of data generated. Need for efficacy data.
- Testing methods change with advances in technology and science.

## Global MRL Challenges: Process

- How to interact with national authorities and provide comments to be considered in the decisions.
- Dealing with differences in MRLs established.
- Various levels of transparency in MRL setting process in national authorities.
- Enforcement procedures and penalties vary among national authorities.
- Procedures and priorities for setting import only MRLs differ by country.
- Capacity limitations of Codex.

## Global MRL Challenges: Policy and Regulation

- MRLs in jeopardy because of government reevaluations.
- Multiple agencies often involved in setting national MRLs (Also an informational challenge).
- National regulatory authorities set MRLs differently.
- Codex MRL intended to be an international standard but more and more individual countries setting their own MRLs.
- Existence of default MRLs differs by country.
- Private standards established if public confidence in national regulatory processes is not high.

## Global MRL Challenges: Policy and Regulation

- No MRL established in country of export; different MRLs established in country of origin and country of export.
- Different national safety standards to be met in establishing the MRL; different calculations of risk.

### **Harmonization Opportunities**

- Crop grouping.
- MRL calculation.
- Uniform test protocols and format of studies.
- Interpretation of residue field trials.
- Number of residue field trials need to establish a domestic MRL and an import MRL.
- Residue definition.
- Review schedules.

## **Thoughts to Promote Progress**

- Each stakeholder industry, grower groups, national regulators, international bodies – should all decide what they could do to promote harmonization and taking on the global MRL challenges; and, then coordinate and unify efforts.
- Not unattainable.
- Takes focusing and continual effort until accomplished.
- Critical to make it happen.
