

Export Growth




Source: USDA-FAS Global Agricultural Trade System (GATS) – WTO Definition

- Quarterly document listing active ingredients undergoing renewal in the EU
- Farmers must be aware of potential loss of substances early in the process
- FAS/Brussels works with Bryant Christie Inc. and FAS/Plant Division to distribute quarterly
- Feedback informs prioritization
- Only includes substances approved for use in the United States



The Commission will engage all relevant stakeholders through public and targeted consultations to gather data and seek their opinions. Relevant stakeholders that will be consulted include, but are not restricted to, farmers and contractors applying pesticides, non-agricultural users of pesticides, health and environmental NGOs, professional associations representing industry and economic actors in relevant sectors (e.g. beekeepers, chemical, pesticide application equipment and seed industries etc.), consumer associations, EU citizens, national competent authorities and scientific experts.

Why we are consulting

Stakeholders will be consulted on the achievements of the SUD, implementation, enforcement and application problems and their underlying causes and on possible ways forward and their impacts. The consultation aims to provide the stakeholders involved in the application of the sustainable use Directive and the wider public with the opportunity to share their experiences.
